FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

I read a very interesting article this week published by the British Science Museum about how colour is disappearing from the world. It was a study of thousands of images divided into 21 categories from the years spanning 1800 to 2020. The results were fascinating. They concluded that over the last 200 years or so, the world has literally become less colourful. The colours of household objects, cars, clothes, buildings, furniture, walls, carpets, signage, billboards, logos (the list goes on) are, with the passing of time, designed more and more in darker tones, blacks and greys.

The paper suggested that this was for a variety of reasons, mainly due to changes in the materials that we use to make things, along with a desire to be neutral and so appeal to the widest possible market and enable mass production. These things are, of course, a matter of personal taste but what a sad thought that the world is becoming a duller place.

It was Dostoevsky who famously said that “the world will be saved by beauty”. This notion that a flawed world can find hope in the abstract and yet sublime concept of beauty is one that the Church shares. Beauty is an integral and essential part of our liturgical life and we all know that beautiful art and music can help raise our minds and hearts to God. This was brought home to me this week as we cleaned St Mary’s on Wednesday morning after Mass (big thank you to all of the volunteers by the way). How blessed we are to have such a beautiful and worthy place in which to worship almighty God.

Beauty, though, is more than just a fleeting stimulus to our senses. It is an enduring, tangible and basic indication of the presence of the Lord. Beauty does not simply refer to things that are pleasing to look at however. The Philosopher, Peter Kreeft once wrote that “there is more beauty in the wrinkled face of Mother Teresa than in the face of the most famous catwalk model, for from it shines joy, humility and love.”

The Church teaches us that things that are Good, True and Beautiful are always intertwined and intimately connected. It is not surprising then that the world losing its colour should coincide with wider society’s fight against truth and goodness. It is our job then, as disciples of Christ, like St Teresa of Calcutta, to make the world a more colourful and beautiful place. We can do this by the love we show to others and by holding fast to the enduring and absolute truths of our faith. If we can do these things, each of us in our own way, will make the world that little bit brighter.
