FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

Remembrance Sunday is one of those occasions that seems to come around very quickly, something that is very familiar to us and something that if we are not careful can lose its significance and meaning.

After the Great War, the nations of the world said collectively “never again” and sadly, we know what happened next. And yet here we are in the year 2022, after a period of relative peace, with war once again raging across the continent of Europe. The war in Ukraine, along with the many other international conflicts that continue across the globe (the ones we ignore because they seem far away) should give us particular pause for thought this year.

Those who gave their lives for this country in the previous two world wars, did so that we might not have to suffer the same fate as them. Their sacrifice was one offered in war that we might live in peace, their blood was shed, that ours might be spared. The greatest honour that we can give the war dead, is to work to preserve the peace, for which they paid the ultimate price and laid down their lives.

It is no coincidence that as the memory of war fades and the world loses sight and need of God, the drums of war beat ever louder. We forget at our peril, that the way of Jesus, the Prince of Peace, is one of radical non-violence. Our Blessed Lord entered a cruel world and allowed violence to be done to him so that death and brutality would no longer have the final say. As His disciples, who follow Him wherever He may go, even unto suffering, have a duty to proclaim His Kingdom and His way of doing things.

There are those who say that war is inevitable, it's one of those things that just has to happen from time to time, and there is nothing we can do about it. To those voices we must ask, “Who is it to be then? Your son? Your father? Your neighbour? Your friend? - You? Who is it that you are willing to send to fight and die in these inevitable wars? Whatever the question is, war is never the answer and we owe the fallen our every effort to work for and to build up peace now and in the future. The hymn, *I vow to thee my country*, so often sung at this time of the year captures perfectly what our response should be to these questions.

“And there's another country I've heard of long ago. Most dear to them that love her, most great to them that know. We may not count her armies, we may not see her King. Her fortress is a faithful heart, her pride is suffering and soul by soul and silently, her shining bounds increase and her ways are ways of gentleness and all her paths are peace.”

As children of God, we are the citizens of that ‘other country’ and it is our mission to increase the shining bounds of the Kingdom. Wars and conflicts are ultimately fought by individuals and so is peace built up, soul by soul and silently.
