#### FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

I was absolutely delighted by the wonderful turn out of people for the Holy Week services and in particular by the number of people who came to all three stages of the Sacred Triduum. There were still seats available, of course, but that simply means that we have room for further growth. Thanks to the contributions of many different people, the ceremonies were beautiful, prayerful and moving. The parish felt very much alive to me!

After all the clearing up was over and things had settled down, I travelled on Tuesday to Rome for a few days to see friends and visit the Vatican. There too, the church at its heart was buzzing and full of life. As I walked around the cobbled streets, we saw so many young priests and nuns full of enthusiasm and group after group of young people on pilgrimage with their school chaplains and parish priests from all corners of the world. There was certainly no sense of decay or decline in St Peter's Square, where over 100,000 people had attended Mass on Easter Sunday. The whole experience was not only uplifting and reassuring but also great fun and full of hope.

On the last day of my trip, I visited Archbishop Gugerotti, whose secretary I had been until coming to Halifax. At that time he was the Pope's representative to Great Britain but he now has a full time job working in the Vatican. After a tour of his very impressive office, covered in frescos by Raphael, we went for lunch, over which he told me some fascinating stories about his time as a young priest working in Rome and working very closely with St John Paul II.

I only really remember St John Paul II in his later years and to me this giant of the Church seems almost a historical figure. Hearing the Archbishop's memories of conversations they had had and work they had done together was truly inspiring. It is with St John Paul II in mind, I would like to share with you an extract from his Easter sermon from 1999.

In the liturgical season running from Easter to Pentecost, the Church is recollected in contemplation of the risen Christ. Thus she relives the primordial experience that lies at the basis of her existence. She feels imbued with the same wonder as Mary Magdalen and the other women who went to Christ's tomb on Easter morning and found it empty. That tomb became the womb of life. Whoever had condemned Jesus, deceived himself that he had buried His cause under an ice-cold tombstone. The disciples themselves gave into the feeling of irreparable failure. We understand their surprise, then, and even their distrust in the news of the empty tomb. But the Risen One did not delay in making himself seen and they yielded to reality. They saw and believed! Two thousand years later, we still sense the unspeakable emotion that overcame them when they heard the Master's greeting: "Peace be with you.'". Christ's Resurrection is the strength, the secret of Christianity. It is not a question of mythology or of mere symbolism, but of a concrete event. It is confirmed by sure and convincing proofs. The acceptance of this truth, although the fruit of the Holy Spirit's grace, rests at the same time on a solid historical base. On the threshold of the third millennium, the new effort of evangelization can begin only from a renewed experience of this Mystery, accepted in faith and witnessed to in life.
