FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

The following paragraph is a message from His Eminence, Vincent Cardinal Nichols:

"Every Easter season is a time of joy. As the Easter prefaces put it, 'overcome with Paschal joy, every land, every people exults in your praise.' This Easter there is a particular occasion for joy in our land, as we shall see King Charles III crowned. Much will be written, and said, about the Coronation in the days to come. As Catholic Christians, we do well to bear in mind that the Coronation is a profoundly religious event. There are few, if any, other countries in the contemporary world in which the accession of the head of state is marked with such overt religious symbolism and prayer. Though there will be important expressions of the diversity of modern society in and around the ceremonial, much of the service is rooted deep in tradition and history. Key elements of the coronation liturgy trace their origins as far back as the twelfth century, the anointing among them. Though there is space only for a few to be present at Westminster Abbey for the Coronation, this is an important moment for us all to unite in prayer. On Friday 5th May, the day before the Coronation, Mass will be celebrated in most of our churches for the intentions of the King, as the culmination of three days of prayer. I invite you to join this prayer, and to attend Mass on the Friday if you can, at this time of significance and joy for us all."

His Eminence is, of course, correct that there are very few nations in this day and age that would allow the accession of a new head of state to be so profoundly entwined with public faith and religion. As Catholics it is our duty to pray for the intentions of the King and indeed for the welfare of the nation. St Paul reminds us in his letter to Timothy "Pray for kings and others in power, so that we may live quiet and peaceful lives as we worship and honour God" (1 Tim 2:2). When we pray for those in authority over us, it does not matter what our personal opinion is of a particular individual. To offer prayer to God is to acknowledge His sovereign hand in our lives and society and imploring His aid in the exercise of just and equitable government is always in the interest of the common good. It is through officials fulfilling their roles well by providing order and peace that we are able to advance the gospel and our religion without interruption.

As part of the coronation oaths, the Archbishop of Canterbury will ask the King "Will you to the utmost of your power maintain the Laws of God and the true profession of the Gospel?" Think how many people today would love to do away with and abolish this profoundly spiritual dimension of our national life? There are, obviously, many issues with our system of government and we are sadly far from the perfect society but how fortunate are we to have the proclamation of the Gospel of Christ as one of the primary duties incumbent upon our head of state.

This coming Saturday is a day of monumental national and historical significance and, let us not forget, it is also opportunity to gather with friends and loved ones spend time together and celebrate. To paraphrase Sir Winston Churchill, "We, whose youth was passed in the august, unchallenged and tranquil glories of the Elizabethan Era, may well feel a thrill in invoking, once more, the prayer and the Anthem, 'God Save the King!'"
