FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

A very Happy Easter to you all! Christ is risen from the tomb and death has been destroyed for ever – Alleluia. Today we celebrate the central tenet of our faith, that God became man, died for our sake and rose from the dead, that when we die, we need not fear but have eternal life. That is what it is all about, that is why we come here, Sunday after Sunday, week after week because this isn't just 'good news', it's the best news. Today's celebration is a reminder to each and every one of you of just how much the Lord loves you and what He has been prepared to do for your sake. We have reflected over the last few days on His suffering, passion and death and yet today, all of that is not forgotten but completed, it is fulfilled and suddenly all of His sufferings and trials make sense. We see how they have infinite value because they have brought us to this point – there can be no resurrection without the crucifixion, no Easter Sunday without Good Friday.

The same is true of our own lives and today's feast brings this reality into sharp relief. Those of us who take up our own cross each day and follow Christ will not always have an easy ride. The Lord never promises His disciples a charmed existence and when we do follow Him, the road will always lead us to Calvary and it is at this point we realise that life can have its sufferings and difficulties. We know, however, that that cross is not the end, there is more to come. If we are faithful, we follow the Lord not only to the cross, but also over the hill, into the garden of the resurrection. Grace and mercy await those He has chosen and we are destined for a life of eternal glory with Him, where the trials of this life will mean less than nothing.

I'd like to address a few words to those of you reading this who are here for Easter Sunday but do not attend Mass as often as you perhaps ought to (that's every Sunday by the way \textcircled). – We live in a world that is seemingly in a state of perpetual crisis, be it the cost of living, banking, pandemic, war and threats of escalation, a world that seems to have lost its grip on reality to the point that people no longer understand what a man or woman is anymore. Amid all of this chaos and confusion stands Jesus, risen from the grave and arms outstretched to embrace us, to hold us and keep us steady. In a world full of turmoil, we all need stability and a rock upon which to build our lives. God and His unfailing love for every single person is that rock and the unchanging, clear and timeless teaching of the Gospel is our surest hope.

If this is your first time to Mass for a while, come again next week. It doesn't matter how long you have been away or where you have been in the meantime, Easter is a time of new life, fresh starts and new beginnings. Make an Easter resolution, to practice your faith, for your own benefit and for the sake of those around you. By rekindling your faith, attending Mass and receiving the sacraments, you have absolutely nothing to lose and only heaven to gain. We live in an age where faith is needed more than ever and what better day to celebrate the new life that faith brings than on this Easter Sunday.

As Catholics and as disciples of the Risen One, we have a duty to celebrate the Lord's triumph over sin and death. I hope that you all have a wonderful time today and do something special to mark this day with your loved ones, remember – this joyful season last for a whole 50 days! Eat plenty of chocolate, enjoy your favourite tipple and when people ask you why you are celebrating, tell them that the Lord is risen.
