FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

You will all be familiar with the name of the person that Mass is being offered for being announced on the bulletin and at the beginning of Mass. Over the last few weeks, however, various parishioners have asked me how to go about having a Mass said for a particular person or intention, as they were unsure. I had just assumed that most people would know about this, but on reflection, why should you? Unless we have been told something, we don't know! So I'll take this as an opportunity to speak briefly about Mass intentions.

Offering Mass for a particular intention is a Catholic tradition that is almost as old as the Church itself. Records dating back to as early as the year 180AD show evidence of early Christians having a Mass said for a loved one. Yet, it is one of the most commonly misunderstood practices in our faith. The reason that this tradition has been passed on for centuries is because of the many spiritual fruits that result from this form of prayer. The celebration of the Eucharist is the highest form of worship in the Catholic Church because we unite ourselves with Christ's sacrifice on the cross in worship of his Father. St. John Paul II emphasized the graces that come when a Mass is offered. "The Church believes that she will be heard, for she prays in union with Christ her Head and Spouse, who takes up this plea of His Bride and joins it to His own redemptive sacrifice."

It is, of course, most common to have Masses offered for the dead. This is linked with our belief in Purgatory. We believe that if a person has died fundamentally at rights with God but still tainted by venial sin and the hurt caused by sin, then God in His divine love and mercy will first purify the soul. After this purification has been completed, the soul will have the holiness and purity needed to enter into the life of heaven. Therefore, just as we now pray for each other, share each other's burdens, and help each other on our journey through life, the faithful on earth can offer prayers and sacrifices to help departed souls undergoing purification to reach heaven, and no better prayer could be offered than that of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

However, Mass need not only be offered for those who have died. Masses can be said for those who are still alive. The Council of Trent says that Mass may be said "for the living and the dead, for sins, satisfactions, and other necessities." In other words, if you know someone who could benefit from the spiritual graces that come with having a Mass said on their behalf, there is no need to delay in doing so. In the same way, rarely do we think of having a Mass offered for a celebration. Is there a better way to show our gratitude to God? Masses can be said for birthdays, anniversaries, in celebration of the reception of the sacraments, or for prayers that have been answered!

So now that you have decided to have a Mass offered, how do you go about doing so? Well, there are small brown envelopes at the back of both our churches that can be filled in with your intention for the Mass and a space for you to request a preferred date on which the Mass will be said, if you have no preference, just leave that part blank. You can then hand the envelope to either me or Deacon John or pop it in the collection basket or through the presbytery door. There is no price tag on the Mass, however, it is customary to make an offering when requesting a Mass for an intention. This is placed inside the envelope. That said, please know that lack of money should never be the reason for deciding against this beautiful tradition.

Please remember too, that in accordance with *Canon 534.1* of the Church's law, I offer Mass once a week on a Sunday for all of the parishioners entrusted to my care.
