FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

With all this good weather that we've been having recently, it has given me an opportunity to get out and to do a bit of gardening. Well... gardening might be a bit of an exaggeration... I've potted up a few plants in the little back yard of the presbytery. It turns out that petunias are harder to keep alive than I realised. The yard doesn't get too much sun and is quite sheltered and so I've had to pick the plants fairly carefully, making sure not to under or over water them. I was out this afternoon, watering can in hand, beholding a rather droopy looking rhododendron and was reminded of an old prayer book that I used to keep in my pew in the seminary chapel, called *The Garden of the Soul*.

The book was written by Bishop Richard Challenor (1691-1781) who described it as "a manual of spiritual exercises and instructions for Christians who, living in the world, aspire to devotion." I always liked this book, I think, because it was straight to the point and gave simple practical advice regarding cultivating a healthy prayer life that nourishes the soul. Spirituality can, at times, seem to be a daunting topic, something that is best left to mystics, visionaries, monks and nuns. And yet all of us have spiritual lives that require tending to — we so often either just forget, or actively choose to ignore them.

Rather like looking after plants, tending to our souls requires balance, time, effort, hard work and a good bit of common sense. Plants will only produce beautiful flowers if the conditions are right and they have received all of the care that they need and the same is true of our spiritual lives. While spirituality and prayer can seem like lofty, impractical concepts, Bishop Challenor in his book outlines the basic necessities of the spiritual life and makes them accessible to the average catholic, like me. Just as plants need, soil, water, sunlight, warmth, nutrients etc. to flourish, so the soul has various needs too.

First of all, our souls need the nourishment of the sacraments, most especially, the Eucharist and absolution in confession, these, he outlines, are the foundation stones of the healthy soul. In addition, we need the protection and intercession of our Blessed Mother. A healthy devotion to Our Lady is crucial for anyone who is attempting to take their spiritual life seriously. This can take the form of saying the rosary, lighting candles and other Marian devotions. Next, we need to keep the communion of saints at the forefront of our minds, not only are they powerful intercessors on our behalf in the presence of God, but they are shining examples to us of ordinary people who have lived exemplary and extraordinary lives. Another neglected friend is our guardian angel – each of us have one and yet how often do we pray to him or ask for his help? Another essential element to nurturing the soul is ensuring that we water it with prayer a little and often. If a plant is left in dry soil for too long and suddenly drowned with buckets of water it can be counterproductive. One of the keys to the spiritual life is dedicating small, realistic and manageable amounts of time to it each day, watering and pruning.

If you're reading this and realise that the garden of your soul has been a bit neglected of late, I suggest that you set aside just 3 minutes of each day to dedicate to prayer, set a timer if you like. Everyone, without exception can carve 3 minutes out of the day (if you say can't - you're lying) and I guarantee, if you manage that, you will undoubtedly spend a little longer.

Go to confession, receive Holy Communion, say the rosary, foster devotion to the saints, pray to your guardian angel, light candles, spend a few minutes in prayer every day and before you know it, the garden of your soul will be in full bloom with peace of mind and joy in your heart.
