#### FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

Over the last few months I have been called to several properties where, without going into unnecessary details, the people there have been experiencing unpleasant spiritual phenomena. When a priest receives such calls, it is important to first rule out any obvious or rational explanations before proceeding to the realm of the spiritual. On a number of occasions, I have in fact found what was going on, to be situations that could only be resolved by spiritual means. It is also important in such circumstances to find out when and how these problems began. The answer is almost invariably to do with people dabbling in the things of the occult. This includes fortune telling, tarot card reading, visiting or speaking with mediums, playing with Ouija boards etc. All of these things are incredibly dangerous because they open us up to a world of spirits that are not of or from God. We might think that they are a bit of harmless fun, but they are not.

I don't think that anyone who has engaged in these practices is deliberately looking to offend God or call upon demonic influences and are probably just looking for answers and resolution. Why then is the Church so strong in her condemnation of these practices? First of all, if we are looking to anything other than God for help with the present or the future, then we are violating the first commandment. In turning to mediums and other practices, what we are doing is attempting to take into our own hands that which belongs to God alone and just as troublingly, we can place ourselves in great danger. While we might begin with wholesome intentions, these things are nevertheless sins against God and against faith. Our first instinct should be to make amends for this though the sacrament of Confession. Through this beautiful sacrament we experience God's unconditional mercy and forgiveness and importantly, break the bonds of any evil we may have inadvertently become tangled in.

As Catholics we do not need to look into the future because what will be is already safely in the hands of God. Nor do we need to communicate with the dead because in the communion of saints, we believe in friendship that goes beyond the grave. As St Monica said to her son St Augustine just before her death "When I am gone, look for me on the altar during Mass, because that is where Jesus is. Where Jesus is, that is where you will find me."

Whist discussing occult practices and the supposed comfort that they bring, Bishop John Barres of Rockville wrote: "This peace of mind hinges on the illusion of control, which will inevitably dissipate the next time we encounter loss or uncertainty. Our faith in God, on the other hand, relies on a surrender and this surrender can provide us with a far different, lasting peace. We are not called to make sense of ineffable mysteries such as death; instead we are called to trust God who is pure love. It is not easy to give up our desire for answers, but we will ultimately find far more comfort in entrusting ourselves to our merciful and loving God who died for us and gives us all that we need to find joy with Him in heaven.
