FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

Last week I managed to go and listen to two very different classical concerts, one, I must say, I enjoy much more than the other. Nevertheless, whenever I see someone who is able to play a musical instrument I am always filled with similar levels of both admiration and jealousy. How marvellous it would be to be able to just pick up any music and play what is in front of you, it almost seems like magic to me. Like most school children, I had a few piano lessons and for a brief spell, to the horror of our neighbours, took lessons on the cornet, neither of which I can play today because I simply did not put in enough time or effort to achieve any success.

Success, of course, always has its price. To learn without studying, to get paid without working etc. are to cheat both nature and reason. No true success is ever achieved without sacrifice and effort. If we enjoy success without having paid for it, it means that someone else has. The Lord reminds us of this frequently in the Gospels – yes – He has paid for our redemption by his blood, but we are still bound to put in some work ourselves, we have to pick up our cross each day and follow him.

So what does success in life actually look like? Is it an abundance of possessions, a high flying career or attaining celebrity status? Of course not. True success in life ultimately means drawing close to Our Lord and following His example. We will only ever make it to Heaven if we practice a life of virtue and virtues are qualities that require constant effort and exercise to hone and retain. The Catechism defines virtue as "an habitual and firm disposition to do the good" (no. 1803). This tells us that virtue requires much more than performing good deeds every once in a while. After all, it is easy to be generous, patient, and kind to others when things are going well in our life: when we're feeling good and enjoying the people we're with. But will we be generous, patient, and kind to the person who happens to be frustrating us right now? Will we be virtuous with our spouse when we're tired? Will we be virtuous with our children when we're experiencing stress at work or feeling overwhelmed in life? The virtuous person is someone you can count on to give the best of themselves consistently, no matter what the circumstances may be.

Strengthening our moral muscles – the virtues – takes time and effort. We might experience tremendous difficulty and failure when we first start battling against our vices. The key here is perseverance. If the child gives up the music lessons because he can't be bothered to practice and it is seemingly too difficult, he will never be able to play in the orchestra. Similarly, if we give up the battle for virtue because it is too hard, we will only remain enslaved in our vices and never be able to give the best of ourselves to God, our spouse, children, and friends.

A helpful exercise is to consider your most important relationships and ask yourself, "Which vices are keeping me from loving these people more?" Once you have the answer to that, you've got something to work on.
