There will be plenty more that we need to raise money for in the future but for now, I think you all deserve a well-earned break and a pat on the back. FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

I was at a friend's wedding reception a few weeks ago and as usual, when you are a priest, people in these situations often approach you and make the same old jokes time and time again. I was chatting to a very nice, well-meaning fellow guest who joked "It must be great only working one day a week". I smiled and forced a little laugh as if no one had ever said that to me before and that I had found what he had said actually funny. I hadn't, of course, but he caught me on a good day. Personally, I have always found Sunday to be the easiest day of the week, yes, there are several Masses to say and a few hundred hands to shake but the day has a rhythm and a pattern of its own, autopilot kicks in and the day carries me through my routine. It is the rest of the week that is unpredictable and throws curveballs here and there.

You might not have noticed, due to the constant torrential downpours that we have been experiencing, but we are almost in the middle of summer. The school year is coming to an end and people are starting to go away for their holidays and various breaks. We all need a rest from time to time but in our busy modern world, which values productivity, success and efficiency above all else, we can be made to feel guilty for taking time out. As human beings, rest is an essential part of life and I know myself, that sometimes I can feel totally and utterly drained. The Lord knows this too though, and from the very beginning has weaved time for rest, into the very fabric of life. On the seventh day of creation, God rested and keeping the Sabbath holy is one of the Ten Commandments (they are commandments not suggestions, by the way).

God has commanded us to set apart one day of the week to rest <u>in Him</u>, to direct our hearts and minds to Him, to offer Him the fruits of our week's work, and to receive His grace to begin another. Sunday must be the highlight of our week, not just because we find respite from work, but because we offer all our labours and ourselves to God the Father during the celebration of Mass, the heart of Sunday. This God-centred focus is extended throughout the whole Sunday rest, where, as St John Paul II wrote, "daily concerns and tasks can find their proper perspective: the material things about which we worry give way to spiritual values; in a moment of encounter and less pressured exchange, we see the true face of the people with whom we live. Even the beauties of nature too often marred by the desire to exploit, which turns against man himself, can be rediscovered and enjoyed to the full."

As the hymn goes "Sweet Sacrament of rest, ark from the ocean's roar, within thy shelter blest, soon may we reach the shore. Save us, for still the tempest raves, save, lest we sink beneath the waves, sweet Sacrament of rest." Our Sabbath rest is not laziness, but is a refocusing of our priorities and a reordering of our concerns. If that means that certain tasks and responsibilities have to take a back seat for the day, then so be it, we should not feel guilty. We cannot render unto God His due if we are exhausted or unnecessarily distracted by the pressures of the week.

Rest, instead of being something passive, is actually an act of resistance. It's an act of resistance against the tyranny of the urgent. It's an act of resistance to the constant demands that are placed on all of us. The Psalmist reminds us of this: He says, "Be still, and know that I am God." And as the Lord told the Apostles, "You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while."
