#### FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

As we enter into the season of Advent it's already beginning to look a lot like Christmas, especially with this bit of snow hanging around. The decorations are up in most places and shops and delivery vans are busier than ever with people ordering, buying and spending.

I saw a reflection this week from Cardinal Dolan who is the Archbishop of New York and whose sitting room overlooks 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Manhattan, from where he can see all the hustle and bustle of busy consumerism. I was expecting the Cardinal to condemn shopping and materialism and talk about the spiritual nature of this time but in fact, he didn't. He made the point that the vast majority of the shoppers that he sees in New York before Christmas are not out buying things for themselves but for other people, things to share and gifts as tokens of love and that, he said, was only a good thing.

His Eminence, I think, is spot on, wanting to give gifts and presents to other people is a good thing and a kind and loving gesture but amidst all of the preparations for Christmas we can forget about ourselves. And I don't mean buying ourselves nice things. I mean preparing ourselves properly for the celebrations of Our Lord's birth. It's no good having all the food in, presents wrapped and cards sent, if in reality, our hearts are far from Him and our soul and spiritual life are neglected. If this is the case, there really isn't much point in celebrating.

The most important thing that should be at the top of your pre-Christmas check list must be going to confession. Only by opening our hearts up to receive the love and mercy that the Lord offers us can we make it a fitting dwelling for Him when He comes. I'll repeat what I've told you from the pulpit before:

If we are serious about our faith and about our relationship with God, confession is not an option, it is a necessity and I don't care where you go or to which priest you go, but I expect all of you to avail yourself of the sacrament before Christmas comes. As you sit there now, coming up with all sorts of excuses as to why you won't. Let me remind you of the usual objections...

- 1) "I had a bad experience with a nasty priest in confession once". Well, I'm very sorry that that was the case and, of course, it should never have happened but that certainly isn't the case here. You have a lovely parish priest ©
- 2) "I'm embarrassed by my sins". I can assure you that no matter what it is that you have done, there is a 0% chance of you bursting into flames when you walk into the confessional. The priest has heard it all before and will never be shocked by anything he hears.
- 3) "It's been so long, I can't remember what to say". If it's been a long time since your last confession, that's all the more reason to go soon. There is nothing more beautiful than returning to the sacraments. The priest will help you if you forget what to do.
- 4) "I don't need to go to confession because I haven't done anything wrong". That's rubbish, we are all sinners by our human nature and there are no prizes for not having committed murder. If this is your excuse, we can start with the sin of pride and take it from there.
- 5) "I can't forgive myself". The beauty of the sacrament is that it does not depend on us. As long as we are truly contrite, it does not matter what we have done or how terrible we have been, the Lord always forgives us. And if God has wiped the slate clean, who are we to hang onto the past?
- 6) "I don't have time". There is the denary day of confessions on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> of December at St Mary's with confessions being heard all day and I will make sure that I am available to hear them after every Sunday Mass until Christmas. Whatever you do, don't deprive yourself of God's love, mercy, grace and forgiveness this Advent, treat yourself to a fresh start.
