FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

And suddenly it is Holy Week... I suspect that for some of us it comes as rather a relief. We might be a bit fed up of our Lenten penances, or at least finding that the zeal with which we entered into Lent is somewhat lagging by now. Such is the difficulty of long preparations — we can easily lose sight of why we began it at all in the first place. So Holy Week comes as an almighty wake up call, another opportunity for us at last to get things right with God, and put our life with him on track again. This week lets us focus on the only thing that, in the end, and certainly at The End, really matters — and that is God and our life with Him.

Holy Week begins today, but with the Sacred Triduum just around the corner we still have time to prepare: in a practical way by trying to shift a few things in our diary so we can be with the Lord in the liturgies of these days, but also by that best preparation of making our confession if we haven't done so recently already, and there is plenty of opportunity for that this week!

We come then to the beginning of the Sacred Triduum when we are invited into the intimacy of the life of Christ and His disciples. On Maundy Thursday, during the Passover He shares with them, He gives them the new commandment: to love one another as He has loved us. And then He institutes those two signs of His great love for us: the Eucharist and the Priesthood. Those two signs are rooted in His love but a love which is founded upon sacrifice. So to prepare for the sacrifice of His own life, the shedding of His blood which will take away our sins, the Lord goes to Gethsemane to pray to His Father. And we follow Him there, and in our watching before the Altar of Repose we try so very hard to stay awake and watch with Him, if only for an hour, to give Him all the time we can in that moment, as He prepared to pour out His life for ours.

And then He is taken from us and the church is strangely empty. "*Oh come and mourn with me awhile*". Though we lose sight of Him we do not cease to look for Him and we follow Him to Calvary on Good Friday. Whilst those around us may have fled to other distractions, we stand with Mary beside the Cross of Christ to witness the greatest act of love anyone will ever make for us, with the Solemn Liturgy of the Passion. And if we can say nothing to Him at all when confronted with the enormity of our sins, surpassed only by the enormity of His love, we might at least come to tell Him 'thank you': thank you for dying for me and for loving me, by bending down and placing a kiss of gratitude and love upon His Holy Cross.

On Holy Saturday when He lies in the tomb we mourn amidst the stillness and the silence that is unique to this day when the church is totally empty, but knowing that we do so in the sure and certain hope of the Resurrection. As darkness falls, we gather together to witness the light that that shines in the darkness, once again kindled, as He bursts from the grave and we are redeemed. We read the scriptures in the light of the Risen One and new Catholics are brought to birth by water and the Holy Spirit. The lights are flung on, the bells are rung, the water is blessed and the world is changed forever.

Then at last it is morning, and everything appears to be different, because He has changed it. On Easter Sunday morning, everything we have been doing for the last few days suddenly makes sense. The Lord is risen from the tomb and death has been destroyed forever. On this most happy morning we no longer have anything to be afraid of. Our joy is complete as the Lord, in His glorified body, wanders through the garden and says to us "Go and tell them that I have risen… just as I said I would".
