# FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

I was talking with a group of priests the other day and as so often happens when priests get together, the conversation took a depressing turn with a discussion about falling numbers of Mass-goers and concerns about the future. This is a refrain that we are all used to hearing and it comes as a surprise to no one, but it is not a picture that I entirely recognise or a future that I believe to be inevitable or inescapable. I see so many signs of growth and life in our parish, and as I have said to you before, managing decline is not something that I am prepared to do. You only have to look at the vast numbers of people who came to church over the Easter Triduum to see that Catholics are out there and are still hungry for God.

By its very nature, our faith is outward looking and universal in purpose and scope. Jesus didn't say, "Preach the Gospel to a couple of your friends" or "Proclaim the Good News only to those who might be interested", the Church and by extension, our parish, is not a private little club. Our Lord said "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" He also instructed His followers that the very gates of hell would not prevail against the Church that He established. Therefore, maintaining things as they are, or managing decline, or treading water is absolutely not what Jesus wants or expects of us and is just not good enough.

I want to suggest then just a few simple ways that we can all help and contribute to the growth of the Church. The expansion of the Church is by no means the exclusive responsibility of the bishop or your parish priest. The Second Vatican Council was very clear that all of the baptised are commissioned as evangelisers and so this is a task that we have to take on together.

First of all, every family who comes to Mass should make it their evangelical responsibility to bring a new person along to church before Christmas. Every one of you reading this knows people who should be going to Mass but aren't. Identify these wandering sheep in your own life and make it your challenge to invite them to Mass with you. If we all brought only one more person, the parish would double in size by the end of the year. (Likewise, if you are a Catholic who only attends Mass a few times a month or sporadically without a valid reason, do something about it. Our obligation is every week.)

Second of all, pray. Ask the Lord, insistently, fervently, even stubbornly, to bring back His scattered sheep. Just as we have to beg the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to gather in His harvest, so we have to beg Him to increase His sheepfold. I would encourage the elderly and the housebound of the parish to take on this specific task. Don't just read this and then forget about it. Do it. Not just once but every day.

A final and most important suggestion is simply: be kind. We don't want these people to come to Mass simply for the sake of it. We want them to come because the Good News of Jesus Christ and the eternal life that He promises is too exciting to keep to ourselves, we want them to share it! And so we should act like it. No one will listen to the Gospel if it is preached by miserable and bitter people. The first marks of the disciple are joy, love and kindness. Our witness has to be one that is worth imitating.

Remember... Bishops don't close churches, lapsed Catholics do that.
