FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

A parishioner was telling me this week that he was “tired of living through moments of history.” When I asked him what he meant by that, he said that what with the pandemic, lockdowns, the death of the Queen, war in Ukraine etc... all the drama was getting too much and he was hoping for a quiet period without any more breaking news.

I absolutely understand the desire for a quiet life, I wouldn't mind one myself! But the fact is, all of these things have happened before and will happen again. There have been great plagues throughout history, war has raged across the continent of Europe and Kings and Queens have come and gone. When we are living in the moment, it can often be difficult to imagine the future or to recall the past. But I was struck this morning at Mass (I'm writing this on Thursday) by the first reading from the book of Ecclesiastes, which was written around about 2500 years ago and I think it's worth reproducing here.

“What was, will be again; what has been done, will be done again; and there is nothing new under the sun. Take anything of which it may be said, “Look now, this is new”. Already, long before our time, it existed. Only no memory remains of earlier times, just as in times to come, next year itself will not be remembered.”

This ancient wisdom has much to say to us today. All things are clear in God's sight and all things are well in His care. We must never fool ourselves into thinking that what we experience today is something new or has never happened before. This goes as much for global events as it does for our personal and family lives, however calm or dramatic they may be.

In the words of one of my favourite hymns: “Be still my soul, thy God doth undertake. To guide the future as he has the past. Thy hope, thy confidence, let nothing shake. All now mysterious, shall be bright at last.”
